GUIDELINES FOR THE PROVISION OF CIVIL MARRIAGE CEREMONIES OR OTHER RELATED SERVICES

- 1. Civil marriage ceremonies will be conducted by the Clerk or designate in the Shared Services Centre Council Chambers at 229 Parkhill Main Street in Parkhill during Municipality of North Middlesex regular business hours weekdays from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm (holidays excluded) for a fee of \$200.00.
- 2. Arrangements for **civil marriage ceremonies** outside of the Shared Services Centre anywhere in Ontario and/or outside regular business hours can be arranged with the Clerk or designate for a fee of \$400.00.
- 3. For couples who legally marry in another country and within six (6) months of their wedding date wish to have a **pledge or commitment ceremony** before family and friends in a location within Ontario, such ceremonies may be conducted for a fee of \$200.00 if held on-site in the Council Chambers during regular Municipality of North Middlesex business hours or for \$400.00 in the Council Chambers outside regular business hours or off-site at any time.
- 4. For couples who are legally married and wish to renew their vows after five (5) years in the Council Chambers or at an outside venue at any time, such **ceremonial renewal of vows** may be conducted at a fee of \$150.00 to be paid in full at scheduling.
- 5. Fee: cash, money order, cheque or debit to be paid to the Municipality of North Middlesex a minimum of five (5) business days prior to the ceremony date. In addition, other deposits or fees may apply:
 - o A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit is required at the time of scheduling for any ceremony.
 - Rehearsal Fee and Renewal of Vows Fee of \$150.00 to be paid in full at scheduling.
 - A \$20.00 per employee witness fee if no witnesses are brought forward and the ceremony is held in the Council Chambers during Municipality of North Middlesex regular business hours.
 - No other gratuities required.

The Rehearsal Fee and fee for Ceremonial Renewal of Vows are non-refundable if cancelled the day before the event or on the event day.

6. A request for a ceremony should be received at least five days prior to the date of the ceremony; special circumstances may permit ceremonies to be held within two hours of a request as determined by the Officiant.

- 7. A pre-ceremony consultation meeting with both applicants (approximately 30 minutes) is mandatory;
 - Both applicants must be in attendance and provide photo identification;
 - To be scheduled a minimum of five business days prior to the ceremony unless changed at the discretion of the Clerk or designate;
 - Fees to be paid in full, estimated additional costs will be given at this meeting;
 - Ceremony information form to be completed;
 - Marriage License to be presented and left with the Officiant (date issued to be within three (3) months prior ceremony) if prepared by the Town;
 - To discuss other municipal locations for the ceremony;
 - Standard vows are available or personalized vows to be provided the day of the preceremony meeting;
 - Music selection (if any), will be discussed; and,
 - To discuss photo opportunities during the ceremony.
- 8. Changes to date and/or time are allowed at no additional charge provided that the location and Officiant are available. The \$50.00 non-refundable deposit will be charged if the ceremony is cancelled prior to the scheduled date. No refund will be issued if the ceremony is cancelled the day of the ceremony, or the applicant(s) and witnesses do not show up for the ceremony.
- 9. The ceremony can take between 10 to 20 minutes depending on the details. Please plan to arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the ceremony to allow time to review final details.
- 10. Depending on the location, additional expenses for mileage and/or accommodation may be requested (see notes).
- 11. Alcohol or stimulants are not to be used by the celebrants or their witnesses prior to the ceremony. If the Officiant believes that alcohol or other stimulants have been used, the ceremony may be cancelled at the discretion of the Officiant.
- 12. Music will be permitted before and after the ceremony (applicants to provide their own equipment). When selecting the type of music, consideration should be given to its appropriateness and contribution to the dignity of the occasion.
- 13. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide an interpreter if they do not speak English and/or require language assistance. The interpreter cannot be one of the witnesses. The interpreter will be required to sign a form that he/she has interpreted the wedding ceremony as per requirements.
- 14. Absolutely no confetti, rice, bird seed etc. is allowed in the Shared Services Centre or on the grounds of the municipal offices or property. Couples may be charged with the cost of cleanup should any be found.
- 15. Guests will be reminded to turn off all electronic equipment prior to the commencement of the ceremony and to remain off until all documents are signed.

NOTES:

- 1. There is no minimum age requirement for a witness, however, it is suggested they should be at least sixteen years of age to be able to understand and appreciate what is taking place and if necessary, give evidence of such at a later date, if required.
- 2. The Record of Solemnization of Marriage given at the ceremony is not a legal record. Approximately 12 weeks after the ceremony, you may apply to the Office of the Registrar General to obtain an official Certificate of Marriage.
- 3. Additional rental fees apply to other municipal facilities. Bookings for these facilities will need to be made through the appropriate Department or organization. Arrangements at private facilities are the responsibility of the couple.
- 4. Ceremonies held at venues outside of one (1) hour or 100 km drive of the boundaries of the Municipality of North Middlesex and/or during inclement weather may be subject to an additional fee to cover accommodations and mileage of the Officiant.
- 5. If personal vows are to be made, they are to be reviewed by the Officiant at least five (5) days prior to the ceremony. It would be appreciated if a written copy of the personal vows is brought to the pre-ceremony meeting.
- 6. The Officiant is only responsible for performing the ceremony and therefore not responsible for other activities for the ceremony (i.e. photography, wedding planning, and organizing).



FEES FOR CIVIL MARRIAGE AND OTHER RELATED SERVICES

Civil Marriage Ceremony

- \$200.00 if held in the Council Chambers during regular Municipality of North Middlesex business hours.
- \$400.00 if held in the Council Chambers outside of regular business hours or held offsite within or outside of the Municipality – depending on the location, may require additional expenses for mileage and/or acommodations (see note#1 below)

Witness Fee

• \$20.00 per employee if ceremony held in the Council Chambers during Municipality of North Middlesex regular business hours.

Pledge or Commitment Ceremony

- For couples who legally marry in another country and within six (6) months of their wedding date wish to have a pledge or commitment ceremony before family and friends in Ontario; \$200.00 if held in the Council Chambers during regular Municipality of North Middlesex business hours.
- \$400.00 if held in the Council Chambers outside of regular business hours or held offsite within or outside of the Municipality – depending on the location, may require additional expenses for mileage and/or acommodations (see note#1 below)

Renewal of Vows

• \$150.00 plus may require additional expenses for mileage and/or accommodations (see note #1 below).

Rehearsal Fee

• \$150.00 plus may require additional expenses for mileage and/or accommodations (see note #1 below).

NOTES:

- 1. Ceremonies held at venues outside of one (1) hour or 100 km drive of the boundaries of the Municipality of North Middlesex and/or during inclement weather may be subject to an additional fee to cover accommodations and travel expenses of the Officiant.
- 2. Additional rental fees apply to other municipal and private facilities. Arrangements for booking of these facilities will need to be made by the couple.
- 3. All fees, with the exception of the on-site civil marriage ceremony held during regular business hours in the Council Chambers and the witness fee, are shared equally between the Municipality and the Officiant to cover costs including salary and mileage.
- 4. A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit is required at the time of scheduling for any civil marriage ceremony or pledge or commitment ceremony. All fees for rehearsals and renewal of vow ceremonies are to be paid in full at scheduling. These are non-refundable if cancelled on the day before or the day of the event unless for unforeseen circumstances at the discretion of the Officiant.
- 5. No other gratuities required.



Frequently Asked Questions

1. What documents are needed for a civil marriage service?

Before meeting with the marriage officiant you should have completed the Civil Marriage Ceremony Form included in this package. Also, you will be required to obtain your Ontario marriage licence (valid for three (3) months following its date of issue), which you will need to show the officiant.

2. Who may officiate the wedding?

In the Municipality of North Middlesex, the Clerk or designate are appointed officiants and may perform wedding ceremonies.

3. Where will the wedding be located?

The ceremony takes place in the Council Chambers, which is located in the Shared Services Centre, 229 Parkhill Main Street, Parkhill, ON. Please inquire with the Municipal Office for more information.

4. Can we get married on Saturday?

Generally, Weddings may take place in the Council Chambers from Monday to Friday during business hours. Officiants may conduct ceremonies outside of regular hours if available. When the ceremony is held outside of business hours a location must be provided.

5. Does the Municipality offer "same day service" for a ceremony?

The Municipality does not offer same day ceremonies. Requests must be made and a pre-ceremony meeting must be conducted a minimum of five (5) days prior to the ceremony.

6. Do we have to purchase our Ontario Licence in the Municipality of North Middlesex to be married in the Municipality of North Middlesex?

No, an Ontario Marriage Licence may be purchased anywhere in the Province of Ontario to be married anywhere in the Province.

7. Are witnesses required for a civil marriage ceremony?

Yes, all couples require two witnesses present during the ceremony. Witnesses must be at least 14 years old and speak English, or have a translator present. If no witnesses are available the Municipality of North Middlesex may supply them upon request. The cost is \$20 per witness if required and this is only available for ceremonies conducted in the Council Chambers.

8. May we include readings from the Bible or have a Blessing at our ceremony?

The marriage officiant may not perform any type of religious ceremony in keeping with the spirit of the Ontario Marriage Act which requires civil ceremonies to be "non-denominational". The couple may have someone other than the officiant provide a reading or a blessing.

9. Who registers our civil marriage?

After the ceremony all parties must sign the Record of Solemnization (to be retained by the couple) and the Statement of Marriage, both are included on the licence. The marriage officiant will ensure all documentation is forwarded to the Office of the Registrar General in Thunder Bay within two (2) business days to register your marriage with the Province of Ontario.
